

MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 14, 2018 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

The following are the Minutes of the February 14, 2018 Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Pompton Lakes that was held in the Council Meeting room of the Municipal Building, 25 Lenox Avenue, Pompton Lakes, New Jersey and was called to order at 7:30 P.M.

In the absence of Mayor Michael Serra, Council President Terri Reicher opened the Meeting and led participants in saluting the flag.

Council President Reicher then read the Open Public Meeting Law Statement of Compliance.

A Roll Call indicated the following members were present: Council President Terri Reicher, Councilmen William Baig, Erik DeLine, Frank Jaconetta and Ekamon Venin. Mayor Michael Serra and Councilman Barranco were excused.

Also present were Borough Attorney Joseph Ragno, Borough Administrator Kevin Boyle and Borough Clerk Elizabeth Brandsness.

MAYOR PRESENTATIONS AND UPDATES:

RESOLUTION 18-69

RESOLUTION APPROVING APPOINTMENT OF CLASS II SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has advised Mayor and Council that Class II Special Police positions have become available due to vacancies; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended Jason D. Ekkers and Thomas Kiritsis who have met all the requirements for these appointments; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Pompton Lakes that:

1. Jason D. Ekkers and Thomas Kiritsis is hereby appointed to Class II Special Police effective February 14, 2018.
2. Compensation to be paid to Jason D. Ekkers and Thomas Kiritsis is \$30.83 which is in accordance with the salary resolution.

Motion moved by Councilman Jaconetta, second by Councilman Baig to approve Resolution 18-60. All voted in favor of the motion.

OATH OF OFFICE

Council President Reicher invited newly appointed Special Officers Jason Ekkers and Thomas Kiritsis to come forward with their families and administered the Oath of Office. Council President Reicher congratulated and welcomed the Special Police Officers and extended her best wishes.

Council President Reicher invited Special Officer William Hennessey to come forward to administer the Oath of Office. Special Officer Hennessey stated this was his twenty second year as an officer. Council President Reicher congratulated Special Officer Hennessey.

PRESENTATION – Certificate of Recognition

Council President Reicher commented on the many volunteers who participated with Annual River Clean Up and invited Maria Kent, Chairwoman of the Environmental Protection Committee and Lauren Venin, Trail Maintenance Committee, to come forward to present certificates for the event. Ms. Kent and Ms. Venin thanked the many volunteers who participated and assisted in the event. Ms. Kent stated the event was successful as approximately forty bags of trash was removed from open space flood plains, parks and recreational areas in the Borough along with silt and debris removed from catch basins, and trail markings were painted along the river trails. Ms. Kent also acknowledged the B.I.D. and a local business (Domino's Pizza) who contributed to the event and town officials who attended.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Motion moved by Councilman Venin, second by Councilman Jaconetta to open the Meeting for Public Comments. All voted in favor of the motion.

RAY JOHNSON, Whitney Avenue

Mr. Johnson commented on ATV activity in the wooded area in back of his home and stated the young adults who ride the vehicles have been destructive and have damaged trees and plant life in the area. Mr. Johnson requested the posting of signage indicating the vehicles are prohibited or barricades fencing off the area at the access points to the park. Mr. Johnson stated his concerns with the enforcement of prohibiting the vehicles in the area and the difficult task of catching those who ride the vehicles. Council President Reicher thanked Mr. Johnson for providing the information and stated she would have Councilman Baig follow up with the Chief Agosto to address the issue.

LAUREN VENIN, Sunset Road

Ms. Venin stated as a representative of the Flood Advisory Board (FAB) she informed the Governing Body that Mr. Steve Grayberg would be moving from town in the near future and she wanted to acknowledge his many efforts with the Board. Ms. Venin stated Mr. Grayberg has provided guidance and support as an Executive Board member and wished him well.

Council President Reicher also expressed her gratitude for all Mr. Grayberg has contributed for the community.

GREGORY COCKEFAIR, Albert Street

Mr. Cockefair thanked the Borough for providing activities for special needs residents.

MARIA KENT, Glen Court

Ms. Kent commented on ATV activity in park and open space land and stated the Borough has an Ordinance prohibiting all-terrain vehicles on Borough public land or recreation areas. Mr. Ragno provided the process when a violation complaint is filed and stated the police request residents involvement to testify with the court proceedings. Ms. Kent suggested signage be posted alerting of no all-terrain vehicles in the park and enforcement of the Ordinance.

RANDY HINTON, Montclair Avenue

Mr. Hinton requested an update on the status for resuming programming on PLTV 77; Mr. Boyle replied **853** and stated the process is almost completed and Cable will need to do one additional update to the system.

Mr. Hinton, a member of the Shade Tree Commission stated he supports the enforcement of prohibiting all-terrain vehicles in wooded areas in the Borough. Mr. Ragno stated it is illegal to ride an ATV in park land and the issue is the difficulty with enforcing the Ordinance. Council President Reicher stated the Mayor and Council would review the Ordinance and discuss the matter with Chief Agosto to determine a course of action to address the violation.

SHARI JOHNSON, Whitney Avenue

Ms. Johnson also commented on the illegal use of all-terrain vehicles in Hershfield Park and noted access within the park for Police vehicles thus allowing for the enforcement of the Ordinance.

Councilman DeLine also commented on the issue of illegal ATV activity in parks and open space land and the difficulty with addressing the issue. Councilman DeLine discussed ways to discourage the riding of all-terrain vehicles and stated the trails in the area may reduce ATV activity.

Motion moved by Councilman DeLine, second by Councilman Baig to close the Meeting for Public Comments. All voted in favor of the motion.

- announced the Pompton Lakes Town Square recently secured two new tenants; Chilton Hospital a primary care physicians facility with open access and a food establishment Sweet Berry. Council President Reicher commented on the efforts of several agencies to assist with seeking a tenant for the former A&P establishment.

- Change of Town Officers (CTO) Day will be held on March 26, 2018 at 7:00pm and commented on the enthusiasm of the students who participated in the past
- commented on the recent Bid Bucks sale promotion by the Business Improvement District and the success of the program
- announced the retirement of Ben Steltzer, Superintendent of the DPW and welcomed his replacement Acting Superintendent Daniel O'Rourke

COUNCILMAN DELINE:

- the Department of Transportation (DOT) is offering free technical assistance with the development of a Complete Streets Implementation Plan. Councilman DeLine explained the project provides for safer streets serviceable for residents of all ages. A survey provided data for the number of people walking and biking in the neighborhoods of Pompton Lakes. - a meeting has been planned with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) to discuss the proposed Community Garden project at Haroldson Place and Riveredge Drive. Councilman DeLine noted the garden would be located in a floodway and he has reached out for guidance with several entities to review the plan.
- commented on the river clean up and encouraged residents to volunteer with the maintenance of the rivers. The Environmental Protection Committee is always seeking volunteers for trail maintenance which occurs four times a year and anyone interested should contact him.
- the Open Space Committee is recommending Council submit an application to Passaic County Open Space requesting the remainder of funding for the Morris Canal Greenway. The Open Space Committee is also requesting a second application to PCOS to reconfigure ball fields located within Willow Field Complex.
- the Board of Education provided a presentation for adopting new technology in Lakeside Middle School. Councilman DeLine stated students are offered the opportunity to experience current technology.

Mr. Hinton questioned if the financial agreement would be available to the public to which Mr. Ragno replied after the document is signed by the Governing Body it would become a public document.

Mr. Hinton commented on the Complete Streets plan and requested the area of Ackerman and Montclair Avenues be included with the plan as residents have requested a 4-way stop sign. Councilman DeLine responded the street plan would not provide an assessment and suggested the Police Department become involved to follow up on the matter. Mr. Boyle also responded the State DOT generally requires 5-10 years of accident evidence to approve 4-way stop signage.

Motion moved by Councilman Jaconetta, second by Councilman Venin to close the Meeting for Public Comments. All voted in favor of the motion.
